





Warm open-plan LAYOUT

The project: Rooms knocked through in an Edinburgh home to create a kitchen open to the living-diner, as well as space for a utility room. Designer: Jeffreys Interiors

The brief: Jeffreys Interiors were hired to completely reconfigure this Scottish flat, including the kitchen. Located at the back of the house, it hadn't been touched for a very long time and was completely unusable. The owners wanted a new modern layout with more space and storage, and were fairly open in terms of what they wanted for the design.

The solution: Relocating the kitchen to the front of the house, to what was previously a bedroom, meant that a wall between this and the living area could be opened up to create a more modern and open-plan scheme. As part of the entire flat reconfiguration, Jeffreys Interiors worked through a number of layouts and the final design meant they were also able to include a separate utility.

Taking the lead from the adjoining living room, the design echoes its palette. The bespoke kitchen was handmade, with solid oak cabinets stained to a dark walnut finish on the lower section, and spray-painted wall-mounted units in Zoffany's Beauvais Lilac on the upper section for a softer look. Reeded glass cabinets provide much-needed storage and sit on the same wall as the door through to the utility, where the cabinetry has been painted in the same lilac shade as the kitchen. The result is a stunning scheme that feels timeless, sophisticated, and beautifully spacious. >
