

Kitchen pantries

Keeping clutter out of sight is a constant battle, which makes a pantry or larder very desirable. Not everyone has space for a walk-in version, but a generous larder cupboard is just as effective and can fit into compact spaces, keeping all the food, crockery and even small appliances out of the way.



Space Tower

The Space Tower from Blum spells the end of losing tins to the back of the cupboard. Deep-set pull-out drawers come all the way out, making everything in them accessible. Each drawer can store up to either 40kg or 70kg, and small dividers in the drawers can create distinct areas to keep food types together.



Double the space

A full-height double larder like this one by Drew Forsyth & Co is an excellent way to keep things in order. With plenty of shelf space, drawers and even a wine rack, everything from crockery to cooking ingredients can be stored behind bi-fold closing doors.



Wonder of wood

Dark Shaker-style cabinets with an equally dark yet contrasting wall colour create a sultry, moody kitchen full of atmosphere. Tongue and groove panels in the rear of the larder cupboard are painted the same colour as the walls, while wood-fronted shelves below keep untidy items out of view.



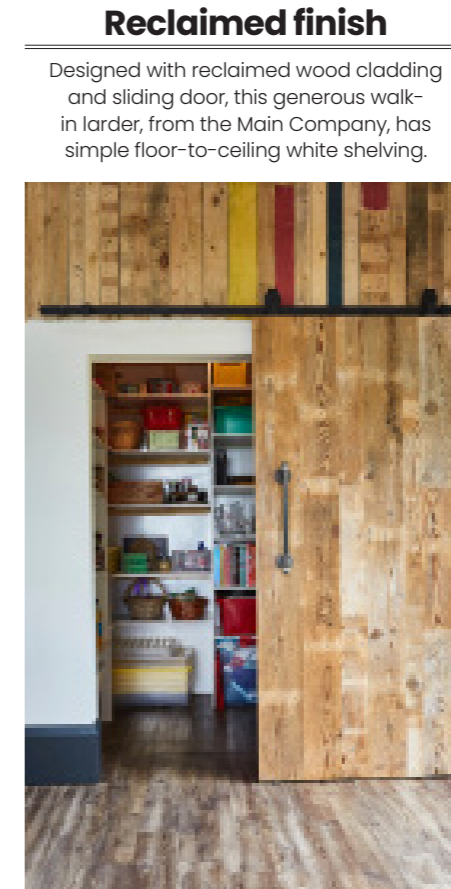
Inbuilt solution

The inbuilt larder in this kitchen has lots of shelving and holders to keep dried goods and food required for a large family. Light colours twinned with pale wood tones make for a rustic look, with curved bottom drawers perfect for storing a range of foodwares or fresh vegetables.



Handleless hideaway

This contemporary pantry is handleless, with straight lines and a cool monotone colour palette, shown here in Graphite. The pantry is part of the Juko Matt range from Caple and has an inner drawer larder unit.



Reclaimed finish

Designed with reclaimed wood cladding and sliding door, this generous walk-in larder, from the Main Company, has simple floor-to-ceiling white shelving.



Hidden away

Tucked away behind the ovens and accessed through what appears to be a single-width full-height cupboard, this pantry, which is from Harvey Jones, is deceptively spacious.



Cooks cupboard

Providing space in a compact kitchen, the pantry was designed by Jeffreys Interiors and Peden and Pringle, painted in Studio Green by Farrow & Ball. All the dry ingredients are perfectly organised and easy to find. The space can also be used as a breakfasting cupboard to tuck away the toaster and kettle, keeping surfaces clear.



Staged shelving

This walk-in pantry by Martin Moore has staged shelving which is stepped at the back, with LED lighting underneath the shelves that automatically turns on when the doors are opened. Wicker baskets keep vegetables in good condition, while a solid marble shelf is the perfect spot for storing ambient foods such as cheese.
